Friday, November 9 at 6:30 p.m.

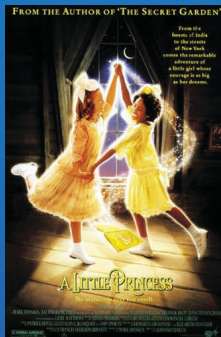


- Knott House Museum will have an outdoor showing of the 1940 film *The Fighting 69th*, starring James Cagney.

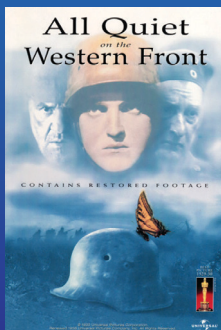


- Museum of Florida History's 2nd Saturday program will feature the 1995 family movie, *A Little Princess*.
